
Recommendations for Warrant Articles for FY2025 voted on 4.11.24 by Sutton Finance & Warrant Advisory Committee

- 1. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, as this is a standard article for Town reports.
- 2. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is a standard article to allow the Cemetery Commissioners to employ themselves in the work of their department.
- 3. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is a standard article to allow Board of Health to employ themselves in the work of their department.
- 4. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, as this is the annual authorization of the Sewer Department budget.
- 5. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, as this is the annual authorization of the Transfer Station budget.
- 6. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is the annual authorization for the Fiscal 2025 budget.
- 7. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is the Fiscal 2025 Capital Plan and an integral part of the Town's budget.
- 8. Removed by James Smith No Vote needed as it will be removed.
- 9. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, Chapter 90 provides state aid for roads and highway projects. This article allows the Town to proceed with these expenditures while awaiting State reimbursement.
- 10. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee no vote needed as it will be removed.
- 11. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, educational tuition stabilization account not used from FY24 recommended that it be placed back into educational tuition stabilization in FY25.
- 12. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, as the funds need to used specifically for applicable Opioid litigation settlement administered by the Police Chief and the Fire Department as outlined by law. Est transfer \$82,653.00.
- 13. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is a legacy item for employees working before 2008, this is a buyback for unused sick and vacation time.
- 14. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, town expense estimated at approximately \$100,000 for a \$3-\$4mm funded by the state to replace a bridge.
- 15. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is for call firefighters who go to a permanent post that allow them to buyback retirement credits.
- 16. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 **not to approve** this article, proper notification was provided to the citizen who didn't attend the meeting nor follow



- proper procedures for this type of process having a town accept the private road as a public roadway.
- 17. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, high impact for an employee with low-cost implications to the town.
- 18. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is a transfer from retained earnings from the Sewer Department Enterprise Account of approximately \$90,000 for repair of a broken connection to Millbury.
- 19. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of this article, this is a transfer from retained earnings from the Sewer Department Enterprise account to upgrade and replace the PLC.
- 20. The Finance and Warrant Advisory Committee voted 5 in favor and 1 opposed to recommend passage of this article, replacement of approximately 60K square ft roof & HVAC units that have aged. MSBA needs approval on the entire amount first before they decide on the reimbursement portion. The town of Sutton share is 8.1% of the debt which if MSBA approval on a 50%-55% of the total would be \$33K-35K annually.
